





IRA investments in climate-smart agriculture and conservation

- Environmental Quality Incentives Program: \$8.45 billion
- Conservation Stewardship Program: \$3.25 billion
- Regional Conservation Partnership Program: \$4.95 billion
- Agricultural Conservation Easement Program: \$1.4 billion
- Conservation Technical Assistance: \$1 billion
- Carbon Sequestration and GHG emissions quantification program: \$300 million

Protecting and Building on the Funding

- As we move towards the 2023 Farm Bill, the IRA climate-smart agriculture funding will increasingly be targeted for cuts
- No new funding, many expensive ag priorities
- Long history of conservation being used as a "pay for" for other priorities

It took a large, unified coalition to get this funding in the first place- it will take an even larger, organized, and unified coalition to protect it.
